Children's Corner Rainbow Eucalyptus Tree

Eucalyptus trees are known for smelling good and the adorable koalas that like to eat the leaves.

Did you know they can be colorful? One type is called the rainbow eucalyptus. When this tree sheds its bark, it almost looks like a colored pencil being sharpened.

While they can get as tall as 250 feet, it is the multicolors that make it stand out. As the rainbow eucalyptus sheds, it first reveals a bright green inner bark. Over time it turns blue, purple, orange and dark red.
